D.1 Consider adoption of Resolution 2021-09-13-001 awarding a construction contract to Garney Companies, Inc. for the Phase 1B Treated Pipeline Segment A Project, contingent upon approval of the award by the Texas Water Development Board. ~ *Graham Moore, P.E., Executive Director*

Background/Information

Alliance Water sought proposals for the Phase 1B Segment A Pipeline Project starting in June with proposals submitted on August 3, 2021. In accordance with the Authority's policies and Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) requirements, the project was advertised for two consecutive weeks in the Hays Free Press and in the Lockhart Post-Register.

The project includes approximately 17-miles of 42-inch/48-inch pipeline and related appurtenances and parallel fiber optic installation from the Authority's Well Field through to the Booster Pump Station. The bid was setup for additive alternates of pipe material (ductile iron, concrete steel cylinder and welded steel) in both 42-inch and 48-inch diameters.

A total of seven proposals were received. The bidding documents utilized a Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) process whereby cost is considered but so too are the qualifications of the contractor to perform the work. The Board confirmed the scoring of the proposals through the adoption of Resolution 202108250-003 that resulted in the selection of Garney Companies for the project.

Because the project was procured utilizing the CSP process, the Authority was able to negotiated changes in scope and/or schedule with the selected contractor to find possible cost savings. Staff worked quickly with Garney to identify and vet various alternatives that result in a total savings of approximately \$977,000.

Executive Director Recommendation

• The Executive Director recommends the Board award the Segment A project to Garney Companies based on the negotiated proposal with a total cost of \$49,471,384.71 for a 48-inch welded steel pipeline.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS AWARDING A CONTRACT TO GARNEY COMPANIES, INC. FOR THE PHASE 1B TREATED PIPELINE SEGMENT A PROJECT CONTINGENT UPON APPROVAL OF THE AWARD BY THE TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD AND CONTINGENT UPON THE BIDDER'S TIMELY SUBMISSION OF SUFFICIENT BONDS AND INSURANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BID DOCUMENTS FOR THE PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD TO EXECUTE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

RECITALS:

- 1. The Alliance Regional Water Authority ("Alliance Water") and the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority ("GBRA") entered into a Water Treatment and Transmission Agreement in June 2018 whereby, in exchange for payment by GBRA, Alliance Water would treat and transmit water to GBRA for their use.
- **2.** Alliance Water sought proposals for the Phase 1B Treated Pipeline Segment A Project (the "Project") in accordance with Alliance Water's purchasing policies and the Texas Water Development Board ("TWDB") guidelines.
- **3.** The Project request for proposals included a Base Proposal Amount and six Add Alternate Proposal Items, including three different materials for the pipe and two different pipe diameters.
- **4.** Alliance Water received seven proposals for the Project which were reviewed and scored by a committee that determined the proposal from Garney Companies, Inc. ("Garney") provides the best value to Alliance Water.
- **5.** GBRA submitted a letter to Alliance Water requesting that a bid alternative allowing for a 48-inch pipeline be selected with GBRA paying for the additional capacity resulting from the increase.
- **6.** The Alliance Water Board of Directors adopted Resolution 20210825-003 on August 25, 2021 confirming the scoring of the proposals for the Project and authorizing Staff to negotiate changes in scope and/or time modifications to the contract that result in price modifications to the Project.
- **7.** Garney has agreed to modifications to the contract as identified in Attachment A to this resolution that result in significant cost savings for the Project.
- **8.** Lockwood, Andrews & Newnam, Inc., the design engineer for the Project, recommends that Alliance Water award the contract to Garney Companies, Inc. for the Project.

9. Alliance Water Staff is in the process of submitting the bidding information to TWDB to allow TWDB to review and approve the proposed contract, as required for projects funded by the TWDB.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY:

- **SECTION 1.** The award of a construction contract to Garney Companies, Inc. for the Phase 1B Treated Pipeline Segment A Project in the Base Proposal amount of \$10,401,738.55 along with Add Alternate F in the amount of \$39,069,646.16 for a total award amount of \$49,471,384.71, contingent upon the bidder's timely submission of sufficient bonds and insurance in accordance with the bid documents for the Project and contingent upon approval of the proposed contract by the TWDB.
- **SECTION 2.** The Project is funded through funds secured through the Texas Water Development Board and based on the Water Treatment and Delivery Agreement with the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority.
- **SECTION 3.** The Chair of Alliance Water's Board of Directors, Chris Betz, is authorized to execute the contract documents for the Project on behalf of Alliance Water.
- **SECTION 4.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.

Documentation of Negotiated Scope Changes in Accordance with Competitive Sealed

Proposal (CSP) Alternative Delivery Method

Dear Mr. Williams:

The Phase 1B Segment A Pipeline Project (Project) was procured using the Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) procurement method. Section 2269.155 of the Texas Government Code allows governmental entities procuring projects under the CSP method to discuss options with the selected offeror for a scope or time modification and any price change associated with the modification. Multiple meetings between the Alliance Regional Water Authority (Alliance Water) and Garney Construction, Inc. (Garney) were held the week of August 30th to discuss potential scope and schedule changes to the Phase 1B Segment A Pipeline Project.

Below is a summary of the scope modifications and related cost savings that Alliance Water has chosen to incorporate into the Project:

- 1. Spreading of mulched wood chips on the easement property in lieu of hauling off the remnants from the property. Specifically, this change modifies Specification Section 31 10 00 "Site Clearing", paragraph 3.4.D.3 to allow any trees within the easement to be mulched and spread on the easement, instead of being disposed of off-site, unless otherwise directed for each property in Table B-1 "Parcel Specific Easement Requirements" in the Project Manual. This results in a cost savings to Alliance Water of \$356,366.04 and is reflected in the modified Bid Item 3.
- 2. Substitute the bedding material for the steel pipe from #67 stone to Modified Grade 5 bedding. Specifically, this change modifies Specification Section 33 05 10 "Utility Trench Excavation, Embedment and Backfill" paragraph 3.4.D.2.b by adding: "3) Modified Grade

5 material meeting the gradation provided in the table below is acceptable for embedment of welded steel piping.

Modified Grade 5 Embedment Material

This results in a cost savings to Alliance Water of \$200,635.90 and is reflected in the modified Bid Item F-10.

- 3. Substitute 72-inch diameter casing with 66-inch diameter casing for open cut and bored casings. Since the product pipeline was selected to be 48-inch steel, the corresponding casing pipe can be reduced in diameter and still allow for ample space for pipe spacers. Specifically, the "Tunnel Steel Encasement Specifications Table" on Sheet 158 is revised to change the casing diameter from 72 inches to 66 inches. This results in a cost savings to Alliance Water of \$120,099.00 and is reflected in Bid Items F-7 and F-8.
- 4. LAN provided revised pressure class limits associated with the 48-inch pipeline versus those for the 42-inch line that were included in the original design plans. The updated pressure class limits results in less steel being needed for the Project. Specifically, the pressure class call-out limits on Sheets 12 through 14 are revised to that indicated in the attached Exhibit A. This results in a cost savings to Alliance Water of \$300,000.00 and is reflected in Bid Items F-9 and F-10.

The scope changes listed above result in total savings to Alliance Water in the amount of \$977,100.94. Accordingly, Garney agrees to execute the attached revised Price Proposal for \$49,471,384.71 and Alliance Water's scheduled September 13, 2021 Board Item will request award of a Construction Contract for this Project to Garney in the same amount, contingent upon approval by the Texas Water Development Board. The summarized scope changes will be reflected in the Conformed Drawings and Conformed Specifications, which will be provided to Garney during the Pre-Construction Meeting.

Bids were received and opened for the Phase 1B Treated Pipeline Segment A project on Tuesday, August 3, 2021. A total of seven bids were received using the Competitive Sealed Proposal process. The final tabulation of bids is attached. The bids included the base bid and six alternates, which consisted of 42- and 48-inch pipe diameters for three pipe materials. Alternate F (48-inch steel pipe) was selected as the preferred alternate for the project. A summary of the four (4) lowest bids, based on the Alternate F bids, is summarized below.
