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C.2 Election of Officers for the May 2022 through April 2023 Board term

Background/Information

Each May the Board will be required to elect Officers for the coming year. The Authority's bylaws identify the following four positions: Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. The duties of each as outlined in the bylaws are described below.

Officer Positions and Duties

Section 4.2. <u>Powers and Duties of the Chair</u>. The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He or she shall have such duties as are assigned by the Board.

Section 4.3. <u>Powers and Duties of the Vice Chair</u>. The Vice Chair shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair upon the Chair's death, absence, disability, or resignation, or upon the Chair's inability to perform the duties of his or her office. Any action taken by the Vice Chair in the performance of the duties of the Chair shall be conclusive evidence of the absence or inability to act of the Chair at the time such action was taken.

Section 4.4. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall have custody of all the funds and securities of the Authority which come into his or her hands. When necessary or proper, he or she may endorse, on behalf of the Authority, for collection, checks, notes and other obligations and shall deposit the same to the credit of the Authority in a bank or banks or depositories designated by the Board; he or she may sign all receipts and vouchers for payments made to the Authority, either alone or jointly with another officer designated by the Board; whenever required by the Board, he or she shall render a statement of the Authority's accounts; he or she shall enter or cause to be entered regularly in the books of the Authority to be kept by him or her for that purpose full and accurate accounts of all moneys received and paid out on account of the Authority; he or she shall perform all acts incident to the position of Treasurer subject to the control of the Board; and he or she shall, if required by the Board, give such bond for the faithful discharge of his or her duties in such form as the Board may require. The Treasurer may, with approval of the Board by resolution, delegate any or all of these duties on an interim or ongoing basis to another Director, the Executive Director, or a member of the Authority staff.

Section 4.5. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall act as secretary of all meetings of the Board and keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board in books provided for that purpose; he or she shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices; he or she may attest the signatures of the Chair on all contracts, conveyances, franchises, bonds, deeds, assignments, mortgages, notes and other instruments of the Authority he or she shall have charge of the Authority's books, records, documents and instruments (except the books of account and financial records and securities of which the Treasurer shall have custody and charge), and such other books and papers as the Board

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may direct, all of which shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any Director at the office of the Authority during business hours; and, he or she shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary subject to the control of the Board. The Secretary may, with approval of the Board by resolution, delegate any or all of these duties on an interim or ongoing basis to another Director, the Executive Director, or a member of the Authority staff.

The following represents the actions taken by the Board of Directors of the Alliance Regional Water Authority (ARWA) in the order they occurred during the meeting. The Board of Directors convened in a meeting on Wednesday, April 27, 2022 at the County Line Special Utility District offices and via video conference call.

A. CALL TO ORDER.

The Alliance Water Board Meeting was called to order at 3:05 p.m. by Mr. Betz.

 if any additional funding is expected to be necessary.

 - Ms. Hughson asked what the advantages are to the open market funding.
 - Ms. Ritter with Specialized Public Finance noted that the likely advantages did not materialize once the timing of the financing was fully evaluated.
 - Mr. Earp stated that his seems like a straight-forward decision.

- Mr. Ramos stated that CRWA is considering funding projects outside of SWIFT due to the red tape involved. Mr. Ramos would be interested in continuing to consider open market funding.
- Motion to direct Staff to pursue SWIFT funding was made by Mr. Earp and seconded by Ms. Hughson and approved on a 12-0 vote.

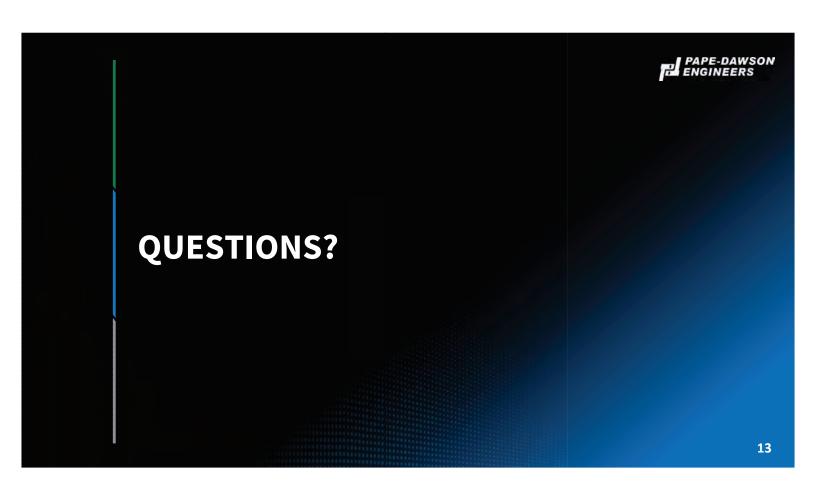

Background/Information

Part of the Water Treatment Plant and Raw Water Infrastructure construction contract with Archer-Western includes a \$500,000 allowance to develop and implement a commissioning and startup plan for the Water Treatment Plant. As the project has progressed Staff feels it would be better if the commissioning plan was developed by the Construction Management and Inspection team and jointly implemented by that team and the contractor. This method will allow the Alliance Water staff and design team to have more direct input into the plan so that we can ensure that it is comprehensive in nature.

The attached proposal from Pape-Dawson is their fee to prepare the Commissioning and Startup Plan. They are proposing to contract with Jeff Haasch with JH Engineering who specializes in developing commissioning plans for treatment plants. The total fee for the effort is \$229,505. It is expected that the Water Treatment Plant contractor, Archer-Western, will still have effort to implement the plan, but the combined cost for both development and implantation is expected to be well below the \$500,000 allowance currently provided for in the construction contract. The development of the plan is anticipated to take 9 months and will include a detailed and prioritized sequencing schedule.

Staff proposes that the effort be added as a Supplemental Amendment to Pape-Dawson's current work order for construction management and inspection services.

Pursuant to your request, HVJ South Central Texas – M&J, Inc. (HVJ) is pleased to submit this proposal to provide Owner quality assurance testing for the above referenced project. This proposal reflects brief scope and fee for construction phase materials engineering and testing services following a brief review of project documents.

Project Description

The Alliance Regional Water Authority Phase 1B Pipeline Segment B project consists of approximately 55,340 LF of 42-inch water and 28,550 LF of 36-inch water pipelines and associated appurtenances and connections. The pipelines are primarily constructed via open-cut methodology but feature trenchless/tunneled crossings of major creeks and roadways/highways, including a 775 LF tunneled crossing of State Highway 130.

Scope of Services

The general scope of material testing and inspection services anticipated for this project is as follows.

- Soils, Base, Concrete and Grout Lab/Field Testing
- Steel Pipe Weld Inspection & Testing

It is understood that materials testing and observations services were estimated on a call-out basis, where personnel will not be present full time during performance of the work unless requested to be present. However, where possible, HVJ-SCTx will work with the CM team to combine testing and inspection activities in an attempt to reduce the number of site visits needed.

Assumptions

The following assumptions were used in the preparation of this proposal:

- For soils and concrete/grout testing, 233 days for one tech and 86 days for second tech at 4 hrs/day are assumed.
- For welding inspections, 160 days at 10 hrs/day are assumed.
- Inspection of O Ring Connections will be performed by others.
- Field inspection of mortar lining and polyurethane coating is not included in this scope. The CWIs will be certified to measure polyurethane coating thickness of field repairs. When scheduled the previous day, the CWIs will perform thickness measurements of polyurethane coating and the only extra fees will be for equipment and reporting.
- 100% visual and 100% testing is assumed for field welds.
- All welds will be tested using the Magnetic Particle method.
- Retest and reinspection costs are not included in the estimate. We will reinspect/retest inside the daily fee as long as it doesn't cause the need to add more service days. As requested, reinspection/retest costs will be separated on invoices to ARWA.
- 1 business day advance notice will be required to schedule services.

This estimate was prepared based on a *11 month* pipe installation schedule with anticipated completion in April 2023. The cost estimate is based on our projections for both the construction schedule and the frequency of service requests from the Client. As the schedule and frequency of service requests are beyond our control, we cannot guarantee that the estimate provided herein will be adequate for the services needed through the entire duration of the construction of this project. We understand that advance authorization will be required if additional funds are needed to complete the testing per project specifications. HVJ will monitor the budget as the work proceeds and will keep you or your designated representative informed.

Scheduling of our personnel for this project will be at the request of you or your designated representatives. To ensure proper scheduling of the work, we require a minimum 24 hour notice (1 full business day, Monday-Friday) to provide on-call personnel.

Services will be invoiced on a unit fee basis in accordance with the attached Construction Phase Services Fee Schedule. Overtime rates of 1.5 times the regular hourly rates will be charged for time worked over 8 hours per day, hours worked before 6:00 AM or after 6:00 PM Monday through Friday, and all hours worked on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY FINDING PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY FOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN WATER PIPELINE EASEMENTS, TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION, ACCESS, SANITARY CONTROL, AND ASSOCIATED EASEMENTS AND CERTAIN FEE ESTATES FOR SEGMENT "W" OF THE ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY, PHASE 1 B WATER LINE PROJECT IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, OVER, ACROSS, UPON AND UNDER CERTAIN PRIVATELY OWNED REAL PROPERTIES; AUTHORIZING ALL APPROPRIATE ACTION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, STAFF, RETAINED ATTORNEYS AND ENGINEERING AND TECHNICAL CONSULTANTS IN THE INSTITUTION AND PROSECUTION OF CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS TO ACQUIRE ANY SUCH NEEDED FEE ESTATES AND EASEMENTS AND TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION, ACCESS, SANITARY CONTROL, AND ASSOCIATED EASEMENTS AND RELATED RIGHTS OF INGRESS AND EGRESS THAT CANNOT BE ACQUIRED THROUGH NEGOTIATION; DECLARING FURTHER NEGOTIATIONS FUTILE; RATIFYING AND AFFIRMING ALL ACTS AND PROCEEDINGS HERETOFORE DONE OR INITIATED BYEMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND ATTORNEYS OF ARWA TO ACQUIRE SUCH PROPERTY INTERESTS INCLUDING NECESSARY ACTS FOR ANY APPLICABLE LIENHOLDERS FOR SUCH PROPERTIES; AUTHORIZING ALL OTHER LAWFUL ACTION NECESSARY AND INCIDENTAL TO SUCH ACQUISITIONS OR EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEEDINGS TO SURVEY, SPECIFY, DEFINE, AND SECURE THE NECESSARY INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY; DECLARING THE SECTIONS OF THE RESOLUTION TO BE SEVERABLE ONE FROM THE OTHER IN THE EVENT ANY SECTION OF THE RESOLUTION IS DETERMINED TO BE INVALID; ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS RESOLUTION IS PASSED WAS NOTICED AND IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, in order to promote public health, safety, and welfare, ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY ("ARWA") hereby finds that public convenience and necessity require acquisition of permanent Pipeline and Right-of-Way Easements and, in some instances, temporary, access, sanitary control, and associated electric easements (cumulatively, "Easements") over, or fee simple title to certain tracts of land identified in the attached Exhibit being more specifically described by metes and bounds in Exhibit "A" for the public use to construct, reconstruct, operate, inspect, maintain and repair water transmission lines and related facilities and improvements within Segment "W" of Phase 1 B of the project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, in order to effectuate the Project, it will be necessary and convenient that agents, representatives, or employees of ARWA lay out the Project, and acquire these property rights from properties for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, operation, inspection, maintenance and repair of the Project; and

WHEREAS, it may be necessary to hire engineers, surveyors, appraisers, attorneys, title companies, architects, or other persons or companies to effect the laying out, establishment, and acquisition of land rights necessary to effectuate said Project; and

WHEREAS, in order to acquire the necessary land rights, it will be or has been necessary for ARWA's agents, representatives, or employees to enter upon the above- described properties for the purpose of surveying and establishing said land titles and to determine adequate compensation for said land rights, to conduct tests, and to negotiate with the owners thereof for the purchase of necessary land rights; and

WHEREAS, it was necessary to set out procedures for the establishment and approval of just compensation for the necessary land rights to be acquired for the Project; and

WHEREAS, as provided for by Texas Water Code, Chapter 65, including Sections 65.201, and the Texas Special District Local Laws Code Chapter 11010, including Sections 11010.101, 11010.102 and 11010.103, the Board finds and determines that each of the parcels of land listed below, and more particularly described in the attached Exhibits (parcels), are necessary or convenient as a part of the system of water pipelines to be constructed, reconstructed, operated, inspected, maintained, or repaired and it is necessary to acquire the Easements and fee simple title in the parcels or such lesser property interests as set forth in the attached Exhibits as part of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that the water pipeline facilities to be constructed or improved on the parcels identified and listed below and those property interests acquired; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that condemnation of the parcels is required; and

WHEREAS, the initiation of condemnation proceedings for the parcels is adopted and authorized by a single order for the parcels, and this first vote by the Board applies to all of the parcels.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ALLIANCE REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1.

- 1. That in order to promote the public health, safety, and welfare, public convenience and necessity require ARWA's acquisition of Easements, fee simple interests, and any such lesser property interests for the public use for construction, reconstruction, operation, maintenance, inspection and repair of water transmission lines and appurtenances over those certain parcels of land described with particularity on Exhibit "A," attached and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set out.
- 2. That ARWA's agents, representatives, or employees are hereby authorized to:
 - a. Lay out the exact location of the land area needed for the necessary property interests described herein;
 - b. Hire such engineers, surveyors, appraisers, title companies, architects, and other persons or companies needed to effect the laying out of the facilities, the establishment and acquisition of easement rights and other rights necessary for the Project;
 - c. Enter upon any property necessary for the purpose of surveying and establishing title, to determine adequate compensation for the necessary land rights, and to conduct tests;
 - d. Negotiate with the owners of any such properties for the purchase thereof;
 - e. To purchase any necessary easements and rights-of-way on, over, under and

across each of the Easements and execute all documents necessary to acquire such necessary land rights;

- f. Initiate eminent domain proceedings against the owner(s) of each of the Easements for acquisition thereof in the event the owner(s) fail to accept a bona fide offer to purchase each of the respective Easements; and
- g. Take whatever further actions deemed appropriate to economically effect the establishment of the Project and appurtenances thereto.
- 3. That all previous acts and proceedings done or initiated by ARWA's agents, representatives, or employees for establishment of the Project, including the negotiation for and/or acquisition of any necessary property rights for any of the Easements are hereby authorized, ratified, approved, confirmed, and validated. This resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this resolution is passed is open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by law.
